

## **Student Information for Y4-12**

#### 1. School Uniform

- 1.1 This is compulsory and cannot be customised. Only items sold in the School Uniform Shop are acceptable items of uniform eg school trousers, PE shorts, etc
- 1.2 Anyone arriving to school with non-regulation uniform will go through the following procedure:
  - 1<sup>st</sup> occasion verbal warning
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> occasion parents asked to ensure correct uniform is worn.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> occasion new items purchased from shop and amount paid or placed on Account.
  - 4<sup>th</sup> occasion asked to go home to change
- 1.3 PE uniform may be worn on PE days.
- 1.4 PE uniform cannot be worn all day for After School Clubs. It must be brought to school and changed into at the end of the day.
- 1.5 Footwear shoulder be black shoes or dark trainers. Brightly coloured trainers or football boots are not allowed.
- 1.6 Hair should be of acceptable length (not shaven or long) and of natural colour (no dyes or tints).
- 1.7 Any change in daily uniform eg non-uniform days, House Colours will be informed in advance.

#### 2. Attendance

- 2.1 Attendance is compulsory without a justifiable reason. The Ministry and CIE have minimum attendance figures for passing.
- 2.2 For exam years (9-12) CIE require 90% attendance for examination entry.
- 2.3 All absence and lateness are recorded on the School Management System and are given to parents, Ministry and University entrance requests
- 2.4 Attendance is taken between 7.45 and 8.00am each school morning
- 2.5 After 8.00am, pupils not present are deemed absent.
- 2.6 Excused absence (personal illness, deaths in immediate family, appointments, visa issues, exteme weather, etc) will not be counted as an absence.
- 2.7 It is important parents inform the school of absence in order for it to be classed as Excused or not.
- 2.8 The School Receptionist will call parents on the third day of any unexplained absence.

## 3. Arrival in the morning.

- 3.1 Pupils wait in the school yard until 7.45. Pupils are not allowed into the school building to put bags or coats inside.
- 3.2 Juniors School Monitors are allowed to go and put chairss and desks correctly and switch on class PCs ready for Registration.

### 4. Lateness

4.1 Pupils arriving after 8.00am need to go to Reception to get a Late Pass to get into class and to get their absence mark converted into a late mark (L). Failure to do this will result in the absence been recorded for the whole day.



## 5. Leaving School Premises

- 5.1 All pupils must have parental permission to leave school between 7.45 and 2.30
- 5.2 An Exit pass will be issued by the Receptionist after permission has been given.
- 5.3 Junior School pupils can only leave if accompanied by an adult.

## 6. Respect and curteousy

- 6.1 All adults in school, whether teachers, administration, maintenance must be treated with equal respect and not abused in any manner.
- 6.2 Pupils are expected to obey instructions from school employees who are performing their duty, and to address them using respectful words and tone.
- 6.3 Courteous behaviour is encouraged towards everyone. Tolerence of different religion and personal appearence is expected at all times.
- 6.4 Reports of disrespectful behaviour will result in an instant punishment.

### 7. Movement around school.

- 7.1 Indoors. This must be quiet and orderly.
  - 7.1.1 No running in corridors. Accidents can happen
  - 7.1.2 No loud noises to disturb others.
  - 7.1.3 Walk on the right to avoid collision

### 7.2 Outdoors

- 6.2.1. Do not make excessive noise which might disturb classes
- 6.2.2. Do not block doorways or steps.
- 6.2.3. Do not run in such a way as to be a hazard to others.

# 8. Break-times.

- 8.1 Leave the building quickly and quietly
- 8.2 No one is allowed in classrooms without a teacher
- 8.3. Food cannot be eaten in the classrooms
- 8.4 During Junior School Breaks, kicking of balls in the Main Yard is not allowed
- 8.5 Pupils must go to the Lines as soon as the bell sounds.
  - 8.5.1 Failure to do this will result in a punishment from the class teacher.
  - 8.5.2 Food should not be eaten in the Lines. This is particularly important during the.

playing of the National Anthem

#### 9. Prohibited items.

9.1 Dangerous items such as knives of any kind, scissors, lighters, weapons



- 9.2 Illegal items drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, e cigarettes
- 9.3 Such items will be confiscated and not returned.
- 9.4 Chewing of gum is not allowed in school.

### 10. Mobile Telephones

- 10.1 Mobile phones are not allowed to be used or seen in school between arriving and. departing.
- 10.2. If a phone is needed after 2.30 it must be deposited with the Receptionist at the beginning of the day.
- 10.3 The following procedure will apply to phones seen in school.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> offence. instant confiscation and returned at 2.30
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> offence instant confiscation and returned to parents.
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> offence instant confiscation and kept until next holiday break

### 11. Classroom conduct

- 11.1 Classrooms are places of learning. They are not play rooms.
- 11.2 Pupils must enter quietly and remain quiet inside.
- 11.3 The subject teachers will designate seating for each pupil.
- 11.4 Pupils cannot leave the room without permission from the teacher.
- 11.5. Pupils in Y1 8 must have a Yellow Card with them if they are out of class during lesson times.
  - 11.5.1 Pupils without a card will be asked to return to the classroom by any adult. employed by the school.

# 12. Detentions

12.1. Teachers can issue detentions and they must be completed. Failure to do this will result in pupils being reported to the Head of Section.



- 12.2 Detentions can be given for half of Break 1 and 2 and for 2.30 2.45 without any prior notice.
- 12.3 Detentions after 2.45 require 24 hrs notice to parents.

# 13. Equipment

- 13.1. It is each pupil's responsibility to bring writing equipment and subject specific equipment to each lesson.
- 14. Aggressive behaviour towards others.
  - 14.1 There is zero tolerance regarding any acts of violence between students.
  - 14.2 Any act of violence will result in an Official Warning Letter being issued. After 3 such letters the pupil can be reported to the Ministry.
  - 14.3 Unprovocked attacks in a classroom on other pupils which includes hitting, slapping kicking, biting will result in:
    - a) removal from the class for a period of time and placed in a Time-Out desk in another classroom.
    - b) removal from the class until parents take them home.
  - 14.4 Physical fights in any area of the school will result in parents having to take their. children home.
    - 14.4.1 Such pupils will be placed on report when they return.
  - 14.5. Serious cases of persistent violence will follow the procedure:
    - 2<sup>nd</sup> offence 1 day exclusion
    - 3<sup>rd</sup> offence 2 day exclusion
    - 4<sup>th</sup> offence 3 day exclusion and Ministry informed.
- 15. Bullying.
  - 15.1 The school regards any form of Bullying as an aggressive act and will deal with situations in a similar way to 14 above.
    - 15.6.1 The first reported incident will be reported to the Form Tutor who hopefully. will be able to resolve the incident.



- 15.6.2. A subsequent report will be referred to the School Counsellor for action.
- 15.6.3 A third report involving the same pupil will be dealt with as an act of Aggression.

# 16. Homework

- 16.1 Homework is not set on a regular basis in order for pupils to do other things at home.
- 16.2. When it is set it must be completed according to the instructions of the teacher.
